Intelligence and Counter-terrorism: New Actors and New Practices

Description

The seminar aims to give a comprehensive introduction to the study of intelligence and counter-terrorism. It provides an understanding of how intelligence is defined, studied and how intelligence services have evolved over time. The seminar will also provide a framework through which students will be able to better understand the challenges that face Intelligence and Counter-terrorism Studies today. Finally, the seminar will introduce the attendees to the practice of intelligence analysis and it should be of particular interest to students with a career desire in intelligence and counter-terrorism, but also students broadly interested in any governmental or private sector analytical role.

Learning structure

The significance of intelligence in counter-terrorism stems from three main drives:

- Its role in pre-emption and disruption of terrorist activity;
- Its role in post-incident investigations;
- Its contribution to preventive/protective security measures;

National security intelligence work is witnessing a paradigmatic shift; we are witnessing a complete disappearance of distinction between foreign and domestic threats; the integration of Law Enforcement (counter-terrorism branch) at all levels of governance becomes a necessity as part of national security work; finally, the impact of radical technological and generational shifts take vis-a-vis the rapid development of information technology must be continually assessed.
