

CALL FOR PAPERS

The next issue of the Journal of Mediterranean and Balkan Intelligence will explore the “Intelligence Education: Serving Scholars and Practitioners”

The topic of the next issue of the Journal of Mediterranean and Balkan Intelligence is “Intelligence Education: Serving Scholars and Practitioners” and aims to highlight the challenges that both the academic and intelligence community are facing in relation to intelligence education. Over the past two decades, scholars and practitioners have debated whether *intelligence* is an academic discipline and offered penetrating insights into issues of intelligence studies. To start with, who does a functioning practice like intelligence, become an academic discipline? Furthermore, what exactly constitutes *intelligence studies*? What is the purpose of intelligence as an academic discipline, to educate scholars, to train professionals or both? Should an intelligence course focus only on theoretical issues or also provide practical skills? How should the curriculum of an intelligence studies program look like? Is there a specific body of knowledge and skills that intelligence students have to obtain? Bearing in mind the multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary nature of intelligence, what is the future of *intelligence education*? The next issue of the JMBI aims to provide a needed perspective on the challenges of intelligence education and calls for papers that address the above topics. In particular, the JMBI is looking for articles that cover theoretical aspects concerning intelligence education, but also case studies of national intelligence education programs.

Instructions for Authors:

Manuscripts must be maximum 8.000 words and they will be accepted with the understanding that their content is unpublished and not submitted for publication elsewhere. All accepted manuscripts and artwork become the property of the publisher. ***Abstracts must be around 400 words.*** All manuscripts including title page, abstracts, tables, and legends, should be typewritten, ***one and half spaced (1 & 1/5).*** All margins should be at least one inch and all pages should be numbered consecutively throughout the manuscript. ***Manuscripts must be submitted electronically in Microsoft Word.*** Titles must be as brief and clear as possible. On the title page include full names of authors, academic and/or other professional affiliations, email accounts and the complete mailing address for correspondence. ***All references should be numbered consecutively at the end of the paper (Endnotes).*** In the text, references should be cited by a superior character of the corresponding number. For further information, consult The Chicago Manual of Style, 14th edition. **All articles undergo a rigorous double-blind peer review process.**
